To help this year collect an egg to paint at either Messy Church 19th March or Mothering Sunday 26th March then come along on Palm Sunday 9th April.



Update.....

The Churches and Primary School raised £242 for the Children's Society at the Christingle. The Reverse Advent Calendar was supported by over 30 families and we estimate that with the Carols on the Chipping the village collected 350Kg of food and £170 for the Foodbank.

On the 30th January we were joined by people from across Gloucestershire along with 6th form students from KLB to hear John Dobai tell his story as a Holocaust survivor. We received donations of £200 for the Holocaust Educational Trust
