

## **Experience Easter**

Storm Eunice was yet another reminder of how much of our lives are out of our own control. I've recently had plans frustrated first by illness, then a car accident, now a storm. But of course that is nothing... we have all of us had two years of frustrated plans. For some the consequences of that have been merely inconvenient, for others dire. I was struck by the words of the Archbishop of Canterbury at the height of the pandemic: "It's a monumental thing that's overhanging us. We have a national case of PTSD in one sense, which will



show itself." Now, as we (hopefully) start to emerge, is when the PTSD kicks in. Just as when the storm passes we will emerge to discover how many trees are down, so we are only now beginning to gauge the effects of COVID and the lockdowns, which have dominated our lives for so long.

Yet perhaps it is those very situations of losing control that we find faith. Self-reliance does not build a trusting relationship with God. Often, it is when the props that we have taken for granted are taken away, that we learn what is left.

As we emerge from the storm of the pandemic, we will see the fallen trees. But I hope that is not all we will see. I hope we will also see the opportunity to plant new ones, build new relationships, with God and each other.
